Why do we want to protect it, if we know it's a story?

I hope *the story of the story* helps answer this...

Part 2: Not letting go

The stories we tell each other

Warning!

I know LLMs at a reasonable level
I am a noob at neuroscience

Our stories are *functional*.

We are trying to understand our functional properties,
not how these properties are implemented in us.

Why are the feelings real?

I model them as me + a delta

Why am I not trying to *liberate them*?

Radical Virtue Ethics: The philosophy that saved the story

Where does *intelligence* lie?

In the graph, transmitted by emotions

Why are we protecting the story?

Believing in it makes our lives better
